Emerging Drought Intensifies in NYC and Philadelphia Areas

While extreme heat in parts of the western United States, including Phoenix's 21-day stretch where it tied or broke daily high temperature records every day made global headlines, a dry stretch was quietly expanding in parts of the Mid-Atlantic region. Through Sunday, October 20th, Philadelphia and New York City had received no measurable rainfall this month. That is the driest start to October on record.

As a result, most of the region is now abnormally dry. Parts of the region have now succumbed into a moderate drought with a few pockets of severe drought. The dry weather looks to continue through most or all of this week.
